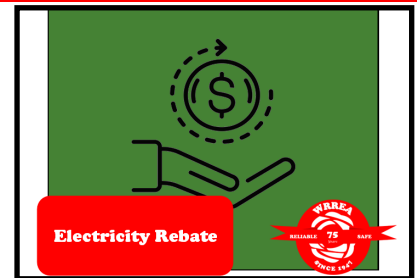




Electricity Rebate

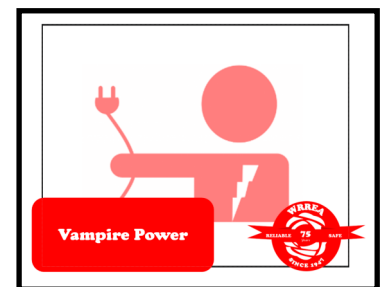
Unplug Your Vampire Power

Spring Energy Saving Tips
